#### 1296. **MINUTES.**

# 1297. DISTRICT REPORT.

#### 1298. GREATER NOTTINGHAM STRATEGIC PLAN.

The Plan is currently out for consultation and it was agreed to support a coordinated response from Kingston on Soar Parish Council, Gotham Parish Council and Thrumpton Parish Meeting. The cost of the advice to support the response will cost £1,800, with the cost being met jointly be the partner parish councils

# 1301. PLANNING APPLICATION: POWER STATION SITE.

The application was considered and it was agreed to object to the proposal on the following grounds. Concerns were raised over the volume of traffic that the new site could generate, with the possibility of "rat running" on the smaller rural roads in the area. The possibility of toxins being released into the atmosphere was flagged up as a concern. The site was considered to be in the green belt and therefore the restrictions on development should therefore apply.
