Shop

We have the Dovecote Farm Shop in the village which sells meat, poultry, some dairy products, bread/confectionery and delicatessen.

Opening times are:

- Tuesday – Friday – 7am – 2pm
- Saturday – 7am – 3pm
- Sunday – 10am – 2pm

Cafe

There is also a café called Dovecote Barn, situated next door to the farm shop. Opening times vary, please check with the farm shop.

Local Amenities

On the A453 at Clifton is a small Tesco and petrol station with a KFC and McDonalds situated next door.

Turning left at the Crusader pub you will find a convenience store and post office.

On the way into Clifton on the left-hand side, there is a small shopping centre, The Triangle, where you will find a butcher's, Tanning shop, B&M Bargains and a Lidl. There is a Morrison's and Iceland supermarket located further down the road.

There are many other shops and takeaways located in Clifton and are all situated on the main shopping street just off Southchurch Drive.

Gotham, our nearest village, has a Spar convenience shop with a post office service within, hairdressers and several public houses.

Refuse Collection

Bins are emptied on the same day each week (Village collections are Tuesdays and Trentside collections are Wednesdays), alternating between Grey one week and then Green and Blue the following week. See Rushcliffe Borough Council collection calendar for schedule. Bin collections vary so please ensure your bins are out in plenty of time.

Green bin

Please note Rushcliffe Borough Council now charge residents £40 per year to empty one green bin. Each additional green bin costs £25 per year.
